





Volunteer Newsletter Spring 2022






Please do get in touch if you are keen to resume volunteering, even if we are not back in your hospital yet.

Online Lámh Information Session Wednesday, 18th of May 7 – 8.30pm Lámh is a manual sign system that can be used by children and adults with communication needs in Ireland. It is a system that supports communication - between parents and child, between siblings, between friends and with other significant people in the child's life. It can be a stepping stone to communicating with the world. Lámh Encourages: Eye Contact Develops Vocabulary Helps Self-Expression Motivates the Person to Try Out New Words Promotes Attention to Movements Can reduce Frustration This information session will give background information on Lámh, how and where to access training and teach participants a few signs which could be helpful in their current volunteering roles. Jeanne Dippenaar has been a Lámh Contract Tutor since 2006 and continues to train groups of interested parties on behalf of the Lámh Development Office



Conference



Jointly organised by Children's Heartbeat Trust Northern Ireland (CHT) and Children in Hospital Ireland (CIH), this virtual conference will delve into some of the key issues related to childhood illness and the impact on families throughout the island of Ireland. It is an opportunity for anyone involved in the area or impacted by childhood illness to come together and collectively explore the issues to learn more about what is working well on the island and consider what is needed to achieve positive and meaningful changes for sick children, their parents, and their families.

Attendees will hear from a range of people active in the field, including advocates, researchers, frontline workers, and parents, all of whom can offer unique insights into the challenges faced by families when a child is sick in hospital. Individualised Play Visits

One particular area of support has been growing for our volunteer service. We continue to receive increasing numbers of requests from clinical nurse specialists and social workers for prolonged and individualised support for some children particularly in need of additional play visits.

We will be working on improving the ways we are able to offer play to these children, including piloting a new volunteer role which would bring in additional volunteers as required to supplement our weekly service.

We will need your ideas, feedback and support to bring this to life. We won't be formalising this project just yet, but do get in touch if it is something that is of interest to you, or may be of interest to your friends or family.

The State of Play in Irish Hospitals

This February we asked play specialists and clinical nurse managers about the current state of play in their hospitals, the number of play specialists employed, the number of play rooms open, and how COVID has impacted play in hospital for themselves and children.

Many playrooms remain closed, and staffing has been difficult. However, play specialists note that while there has been fewer play materials and spaces, there has been great creativity to keep play going. Where there are play specialists, one to one play and single use toys have kept play alive for children throughout COVID restrictions.










Resources in Ukrainian
